#### Month of the Souls in Purgatory



Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. They are certain of entering Heaven, but first they must suffer in Purgatory. The Holy Souls cannot help themselves because for them the night has come, when no man can work (John 9:4). It is our great privilege of brotherhood that we can shorten their time of separation from God by our prayers, good works, and, especially, the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.

#### Letter from Father Joy Thomas Nellissery, Ph.D.

#### **GOLDEN JUBILEE**

Of Our Lady Queen of the Universe, Huntsville, AL-35810

Dear Parish Family,

I write this note to you to thank you for your generous support of the parish and to personally invite you to two very important spiritual milestones of our parish: I) Opening of the Holy Door of Mercy in our Church, and 2) Our upcoming Golden Jubilee Year. Indeed, I am so excited about the spiritual opportunities these events bring to us.

Number Seven in the Holy Bible means covenant. Seventh day, Seventh year, and multiplication of seven by seven, all are sacred times for renewal of the covenant with God. God commanded us to celebrate the 49th year as Jubilee (Leviticus 25:1-55). Jubilee is a sacred time that evolves from the basic notion of Sabbath. Sabbath is a time and space where eternity and divine presence gently enter our human time and space and remove all chaos and reestablish peace in us. In short, Jubilee is an expansion of the Sabbath process of reestablishing harmony through liberation and rest. The process of celebrating Jubilee includes: 1) Thanksgiving, 2) Reconciliation and liberation within and with others, 3) Praying for each other, 4) Acknowledging our everyday interdependence, 5) Reaching out to the forgotten, 6) Developing a spiritual life rooted in the Word, the Sacraments and service, and 7) Rest - allowing God to remove the internal chaos. Please make these 7 areas of your life a priority.

Our Bishop, The Most Reverend Robert J. Baker, S.T.D., has honored our Parish by allowing us to be a HOLY DOOR OF MERCY. On Sunday, October 30th, at 8.45 am., His Excellency Bishop Baker will declare, bless the Mercy Door, open the Door, and lead us through it. The Holy Mass follows.

On Wednesday, November 9th, at 6.30 pm., His Excellency Bishop Emeritus David Foley, DD., will lead the parish through the Holy Door, inaugurate the Golden Jubilee by lighting the Jubilee Candle, preside our Thanksgiving Mass, and rejoice with us at the reception thereafter.

I invite, encourage, and appeal to each one you to come, and participate in both these spiritual events. I count on you. Let us take this Jubilee opportunity seriously that our spiritual pilgrimage in this world will be a meaningful journey of renewal and rebuilding our lives that creates good memories of harmony for everyone that our Patroness may introduce us to our Savior "now and at the hour of our death".

From the moment of our founding in 1882, charity has been the first principle of the Knights of Columbus. We are men of faith and men of action.

In 2014, we set new records in charitable giving for the 16<sup>th</sup> consecutive year. Our charitable contributions increased in 2014 by more than \$3.4 million over the previous year to a record \$173,550,680. In addition, we achieved our highest level of charitable service, volunteering more than 71.5 million hours. The number of service hours contributed by members rose in 2014 by more than a million hours over the 2013 total, with each member donating nearly a full workweek on average.

Our charitable activities encompass an almost infinite variety of local, national and international projects. From international charitable partnerships with Special Olympics, the Global Wheelchair Mission and Habitat for Humanity to our own Food for Families and Coats for Kids projects and other purely local charities, the opportunity to work together with fellow Knights and their families is virtually endless.

We undertake these acts of charity because we see those in need through the eyes of faith. Moreover, in the Knights of Columbus, we approach these acts of charity together. Pope Benedict XVI calls this the "practice of love...as a community."

#### The Patriot Degree

On February 22, 1900, the first exemplification of this degree was held in New York City. The ritual added patriotism to the three original principles of the Order: charity, unity and fraternity. Any Third Degree member in good standing, one year after the anniversary of his First Degree, was eligible for membership in the Fourth Degree. Currently, any member of the Third Degree in good standing, regardless how long he has been a Knight, may join the



Fourth Degree. The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of and loyalty to the Knights' respective countries through active membership in local Fourth Degree groups called assemblies. Fourth Degree members must retain their membership as Third Degree members in the local council to remain in good standing.
