October Devotion: the Holy Rosary

Since the 16th century Catholic piety has assigned entire months to special devotions. Pope Leo XIII personally started the practice of devoting October to the Rosary devotion. In a letter of September 1, 1883, mindful of the Rosary's power to strengthen faith and foster a life of virtue, he outlined the triumphs of the Rosary in past times and admonished the faithful to dedicate the month of October to the Blessed Virgin through the daily recitation of her Rosary in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament, in order to obtain through her intercession the grace that God would console and defend His Church in her sufferings.

We highly recommend that you read Pope John Paul II's Apostolic Letter Rosarium Virginis Mariae, or "On the Most Holy Rosary." It explains even further this wonderful devotion, and introduces the optional mysteries of light, or Luminous mysteries.

4th Degree Shirts and Hats

If you are looking for a 4th Degree Embroidered shirt, hat, or jacket, you may consider Knights Gear. You may also consider Valley Trophy, 3016 University Dr NW Ste C, Huntsville, AL 35816, (256) 533-9046. Belinda will address your wishes and make you whatever you want. They have the patterns and are aware of the differences between the council or assembly. But bring a picture if you have concerns. You can bring your own shirt or order one from her. Single orders or group orders are an option and prices will vary. If wondering, the Assembly number is 0004 and the name of the assembly is the 'Father Jeremiah F. Trecy Assembly 0004'.

Proper wear of the 4th Degree uniform

Official Regalia Dress (C.C. Drill manual page 10 and 12)

All members wearing the complete 4th Degree Official Regalia Dress Uniform will always wear the 4th Degree tie and 4th Degree lapel pin with the uniform coat and slacks. Black belt, shoes and socks are also required. Do not stand out from your brother Sir Knights. The shirt will not have a button down collar, cuff links or studs. No tie clip, name tags or pins will be worn on this uniform. There is only one 4th Degree Lapel pin, PG-113, though some members will wear an older version. Continue to wear the PG-113.

You may, if previously presented, wear the miniature Medals of Office (jewels) you earned or current Medals of the Office (Council or Assembly) you hold now. There is no need or authorization to wear two large medals simultaneously or two Miniature Medals of the same office you may have held more than once e.g., past grand Knight from two different one year periods or two different councils. You may simultaneously wear a miniature Past Grand Knight and the larger Grand Knight Medal if that is your current position in the council and you previously completed service as a Grand Knight. Again, do not stand out from you fellow Sir Knights.

Official Regalia Dress – Color Corps (C.C. Drill manual page 11 and 13)

The Official Regalia Dress of the Color Corps is the Regalia Dress and the addition of the Service Baldric, Beret, White Gloves and Swords with Scabbard. You will only wear the beret, service baldric and gloves while performing Color Corps duties like a parade, honor guard or color guard. Often Clergy ask that the sword not be worn. We will always abide by the host council or Clergy direction. The service is no less professional without the sword. In all cases the service baldric will be worn with or without the sword. Past Faithful Navigators may choose to wear a white handled Sword. This is not prohibited but not referenced in the Color Corps manual. The white sword was normal gear for the white cape of the older uniform and you will see many Sir Knights with the white sword and the miniature Past Faithful Navigator Jewel.

In Service to One, In Service to All

From the moment of our founding in 1882, charity has been the first principle of the Knights of Columbus. We are Catholic men of faith and men of charitable action.

In 2016, the Knights of Columbus set a record in charitable giving for the 18th consecutive year. Our charitable donations increased from \$175 million in 2015 to a new total of \$177,500,673 in 2016. In addition, we achieved our highest level of charitable service in 2016, volunteering more than 75 million hours of service. The number of service hours contributed by Knights rose in 2016 by more than a million over the previous year's total.

Our charitable activities encompass an almost infinite variety of local, national and international projects. Our own unique charities include the Christian Refugee Relief Fund, Disaster Relief, Ultrasound Initiative, and Coats for Kids. We also partner with international charities including Special Olympics, the Global Wheelchair Mission and Habitat for Humanity.

Through our Building the Domestic Church initiative, Knights and their families have greater opportunities to participate in a variety of activities that deepen their faith, promote the New Evangelization, and strengthen our parishes.

"We are answering Pope Francis' call to go to the peripheries," Supreme Knight Carl Anderson said. "We can reach half way around the globe to help those in need and we can reach to our neighbor next door. And we do that every day. That makes us witnesses to the faith."

The Patriot Degree

On February 22, 1900, the first exemplification of this degree was held in New York City. The ritual added patriotism to the three original principles of the Order: charity, unity and fraternity. Any Third Degree member in good standing, one year after the anniversary of his First Degree, was eligible for membership in the Fourth Degree. Currently, any member of the Third Degree in good standing, regardless how long he has been a Knight, may join the



Fourth Degree. The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of and loyalty to the Knights' respective countries through active membership in local Fourth Degree groups called assemblies. Fourth Degree members must retain their membership as Third Degree members in the local council to remain in good standing.
