September Devotion - Our Lady of Sorrows



By Tradition, the Catholic Church dedicates the month of September is traditionally dedicated to the Seven Sorrows (or *Dolours*) of Mary, and the Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows falls in September. The Sorrows are: the prophecy of Simeon, the flight into Egypt, the loss of the Holy Child at Jerusalem for three days, meeting Jesus on his way to Calvary, standing at the foot of the Cross, Jesus being taken from the Cross, and the burial of Christ.

The feast of Our Lady of Sorrows (Sept. 15th) and the devotion to the seven sorrows call on us to reflect on the intense reality of Mary's personal suffering; her compassion and suffering show us the way of true repentance. As ever, she is a guide and role model for all members of the Church. As Mary did, so should we share in Christ's suffering and death, in order to share in His rising to new life.

Prayer

Hallowed Mother, do this favour: Those Wounds that gored my Saviour, deeply on my heart engraved. Mine it be, Christ's throes in sharing. Mine it be, his anguish bearing. These, his wounds, to keep in mind. From the flame of hell unending, be thou, Virgin, me defending, in that dreadful reckoning day! When in death my eyes are closing, open them, Lord, to see reposing, Victory's crown in Mary's hand. When my frame by death is broken, and my doom by thee is spoken, be it, Lord, the better land.

I beseech you, O Lord Jesus Christ, that the Blessed Virgin Mary, whose most holy soul was pierced in the hour of your Passion by the sword of sorrow, may intercede for us with Your mercy now and at the hour of our death.

Notes from the Navigator (continued)

The Diocese of Birmingham and the Knights of Columbus organizations are going to pitch in and help. What I propose to do is to wait and find out what kind of help or assistance that the Assembly can render to assist in the recovery. The tendency is to jump in and do something, which is a natural reaction. What we should not do, is to send aid or help that is not needed, or send the wrong type of aid. Our Assembly for the most part cannot be part of the first responders. When the floodwaters are gone, and the affected areas of Texas are safe, lives need to be put back together as best as they can. No one knows at this time what type of aid is going to be needed over the next weeks and months. Helping put lives back together has many aspects, such reestablishing schools for children, which will require everything schools need to cause the learning to begin again. One could sit down and come up with laundry list of things needed, but we are basically 1000 miles away and don't know for sure what is needed now in and the weeks and months to come. What our Assembly needs to do is find out what, when, and how to help. We first need to find out exactly what the Diocese and Knights of Columbus what to do, so our part will be done in an organized and timely manner. By the time of our next meeting, hopefully, information flowing down through the Council and Assembly channels can cause our Assembly to structure a plan to help.

Let us all keep the people of Texas in our prayers.

From the Assembly Color Corps Commander:

Assembly 4 Sir Knights,

- 1. There is still opportunity to purchase the uniform at "Knights Gears' reduced prices
- 2. There is a cutoff for wear of the current uniform
- 3. There is only one 4th Degree lapel pin allowed for wear (I have seen many different worn)
- 4. Social Baldrics will not have a future with this uniform

The reduced price may be extended which make me question, how can they reduce the price if they do not make any money on the item? If they reduce the price below cost, who is paying for that? I have not yet heard of purchasing separates (Jacket or slacks separate from the complete package) since none of us will gain or lose weight over the next 30 years - right? Lynch and Kelly or an alternate supplier is spoke about. I expect at least one other supplier. What about returns?? Anyway, 5 of your fellow Assembly Brothers have told me they are purchasing so we are almost at the Honor Guard level! So we will continue to support when called .

Please see email from the District Master and attachment from the VSM. As many of you know they are enforcing the June 30, 2018 date for the Regalia. Those who wish to participate in a Color Corps, must wear the New Regalia. Some key items:

For members who wish to join the 4th degree, only a dark suit, dark tie, black shoes, and white shirt will be required going forward, this could possibly be big for recruiting.

Members of the exemplification team will be required to either purchase the new regalia or use the ceremonial gowns.

Social Baldric will no longer be worn after the cutoff date and current regalia will not be worn either.

Supreme is considering extending the discount.

Attached is a letter I just received from VSM Ruh reference a conference call he was on today with Supreme Master Stoddard. Please read this and pass this information along to your membership. There has been must discussion and negative comments concerning the new uniform - after reading this letter, feel free to express your opinions, in a respectful manner, to the Supreme Master. We are at a major crossroads for the 4th degree, the introduction of the new uniform is having a major impact on the order, unfortunately in a negative way. I ask that you keep the core principles of the order in mind and ask your members to use their heads and not their emotions in their actions. As always, thank you all for what you do for the order and the church - I am always available to answer questions.

Fourth Degree Letter from VSM, DM, FN

AUGUST 21, 2017

Worthy Sirs,

I had a conference call with the Supreme Master today and all VSM's. I want to bring all my brothers up to speed on this important matter. As these were the things discussed in the conversation.

- 1. Any size now can be ordered through Knights Gear.
- 2. In an exemplification all candidates may wear a dark colored business suit with a white shirt and appropriate tie
- 3. Exemplars may wear the same or the robes for the exemplification.
- 4. Supreme is tossing around the idea of extending the 25% discount for a longer period so you may order your uniform.
- 5. The Flash (colored portion of beret) has been ordered and soon there will be a drop down for you to order the color you need.
- 6. The PG-13 is the absolute pin of the order now. **NO OTHER**
- 7. After June 30, 2018 any assembly that continues to wear the old regalia the Navigator will receive a call from the Master on the possibility of him being removed from office.
- 8. Installations can now be done in the dark suit.
- 9. You are now to drop out the part in the antechamber concerning the baldric, just discuss the pin.
- 10. By June 30, 2018 ALL marshals are to be on board with wearing the new uniform as they represent the Master. If they cannot removal from office is eminent.
- 11. There is a possibility of Lynch and Kelly becoming a sales or just a shipper for the Order.
- 12. Bottom line is June 30,2018 NO REGÁLIA---NEW UNIFORM ONLY----If cannot abide by this your assemblies will have no Color Corps.
- 13. After June 30,2018 the Social Baldric will be prohibited.
- 14. With the New Uniform you may wear the Service Baldric with the Sword of Liberty and white gloves for ceremonial occasions and Honor Guards.
- 15. Here is the information on the website. Please look up and see the question and answers there.

I am passing on as much information as I can as I feel all of us need this information. I am also giving you permission to send this information to any of your members that you feel necessary. I would like to see the tension come to a point of ease and I do not want my brothers to miss out the chance of a savings on the uniform. Myself and in the future VSM appointee Mike Porter will keep you abreast of all we can find out and let you know all. You now know as much as we know. It was also stated in the phone call that if your assembly decides not to purchase any of the new uniform that is fine with Supreme. It is just after June 30,2018 you will NO LONGER have a Color Corps for any function.

My Friends and brothers I ask you to make a decision on what your heart tells you and take that course. Just remember whatever you decide to do you will still be a member of the Fourth Degree. Please express all thoughts in writing good or bad with brotherly language to the Supreme Master and you might be heard. Some of the things requested have been heard and changed already. Just do what your heart tells you to do and not what others tell you.

The Feast of Our Lady of Sorrows

Since the early middle ages, the Church in the West has celebrated the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows in mid-September, a devotion to the suffering and spiritual martyrdom of the Blessed Mother of Our Lord. The name Our Lady of Sorrows was first used by the Servites, or the Friar Servants of Mary, an order that was founded in 1233. The original intention of the order was a devotion to the Virgin Mary, in particular Our Lady of Sorrows. As an order, the Servites promote the Scapular of Our Lady of Sorrows, the Chaplet of the Seven Sorrows of Our Lady (a special rosary made of seven sets of seven beads rather than five decades), and the Way of the Cross for the Sorrowful Mother, or *Via Matris*. The name Our Lady of Sorrows was given in reference to the devotion to the Seven Sorrows, or *Dolors*, of Mary. Devotion to the sorrows of Mary is a reminder of the bond between Mary and Jesus, and that as the Mother of God, she suffered greatly and felt very real pain on behalf of the suffering of her son.

The first known altar to *Mater Dolorosa*, Mother of Sorrows, was set up in the monastery of Schönau, in 1221. Throughout the next couple centuries, devotion to the suffering of Mary grew, however the feast of Our Lady of Sorrows was not yet included on the official Tridentine Calender as of 1570. It was in 1667 that approval for the celebration of the feast was granted to the Servite order, and then in 1814 it was extended to the whole of the Latin church, and added to the Roman Calender by Pope Pius VII. Prior to 1913, it was celebrated on the 3rd Sunday of September; in that year Pope Pius X moved the feast to the 15th of September, an octave of the birthday of Our Lady, which is celebrated on September 8th.

The feast and the devotion to the seven sorrows call on us to reflect on the intense reality of Mary's personal suffering; her compassion and suffering show us the way of true repentance. As ever, she is a guide and role model for all members of the Church. As Mary did, so should we share in Christ's suffering and death, in order to share in His rising to new life.

On February 22, 1900, the first exemplification of this degree was held in New York City. The ritual added patriotism to the three original principles of the Order: charity, unity and fraternity. Any Third Degree member in good standing, one year after the anniversary of his First Degree, was eligible for membership in the Fourth Degree. Currently, any member of the Third Degree in good standing, regardless how long he has been a Knight, may join the



Fourth Degree. The primary purpose of the Fourth Degree is to foster the spirit of patriotism by promoting responsible citizenship and a love of and loyalty to the Knights' respective countries through active membership in local Fourth Degree groups called assemblies. Fourth Degree members must retain their membership as Third Degree members in the local council to remain in good standing.
